

The Lighting of the Advent Wreath:

The Third Sunday of Advent:

Priest: Today we light the first, second and third candles of the Advent wreath.

Each candle has a meaning. This first candle is HOPE, the second candle is PEACE, and the third candle is JOY.

The candles are lit by representatives of the Vestry.

Vestry: Isaiah 55:12 – You will go out in joy and be led forth in peace;

the mountains and hills will burst into song before you,

and all the trees of the field will clap their hands.

People: Gracious God, you came to us in human flesh and you abide with us

in the Holy Spirit. Fill us with your joy, and help us shine as a light to

the world. Through Jesus Christ, who makes our joy complete.

Amen.

The Lesson from the Old Testament:

Zephaniah 3:14-20

Sing aloud, O daughter Zion; shout, O Israel! Rejoice and exult with all your heart, O daughter Jerusalem! The LORD has taken away the judgments against you, he has turned away your enemies. The king of Israel, the LORD, is in your midst; you shall fear disaster no more.

On that day it shall be said to Jerusalem: Do not fear, O Zion; do not let your hands grow weak. The LORD, your God, is in your midst, a warrior who gives victory; he will rejoice over you with gladness, he will renew you in his love; he will exult over you with loud singing as on a day of festival. I will remove disaster from you, so that you will not bear reproach for it. I will deal with all your oppressors at that time. And I will save the lame and gather the outcast, and I will change their shame into praise and renown in all the earth. At that time I will bring you home, at the time when I gather you; for I will make you renowned and praised among all the peoples of the earth, when I restore your fortunes before your eyes, says the LORD.

Reader: The Word of the Lord. *People:* Thanks be to God.

Children will return at the Passing of the Peace.


The Lesson from the New Testament:


Philippians 4:4-7

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say: Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Reader: The Word of the Lord. *People:* Thanks be to God.

The Holy Gospel:

Luke 3:7-18

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. *People:* Glory to you, Lord Christ.

John said to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruits worthy of repentance. Do not begin to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our ancestor"; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire."

And the crowds asked him, "What then should we do?" In reply he said to them, "Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise." Even tax collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, "Teacher, what should we do?" He said to them, "Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you." Soldiers also asked him, "And we, what should we do?" He said to them, "Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages."

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals.

He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people.

The Gospel of the Lord.

People: Praise to you, Lord Christ.

The Sermon:

A time of silence follows the Sermon. Please remain seated until the Altar Ministers stand.

The Nicene Creed: BCP 358

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God,
eternally begotten of the Father,
God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God,
begotten, not made,
of one Being with the Father.
Through him all things were made.
For us and for our salvation
he came down from heaven:
by the power of the Holy Spirit
he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary,
and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures;

he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son.
With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified.
He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come.

Amen.

All stand or kneel for the prayers as they are able.

The Prayers of the People:

The Prayers of the People are a combination of Form II (BCP 385) and Advent Prayers from "Liturgy for the Whole Church"

Leader: I ask your prayers for God's people throughout the world; for our Bishop José; for this gathering; and for all ministers and people. Pray for the Church.

People: God of the prophets, give your church courage to speak truth, and to tell of your love.

Leader: I ask your prayers for peace; for goodwill among nations; and for the well-being of all people. Pray for justice and peace.

People: God of the angels, give your church voice to sing about your presence into the world, give the world a freedom song, and help us to declare the promise of peace.

Leader: I ask your prayers for the poor, the sick, the hungry, the oppressed, and those in prison. Pray for those in need or trouble.

People: God of the magi, give your church gifts, and the will to leave home to find you among the poor.

Leader: I invite prayers for those who are dear to you.

The people are invited to offer prayers and hopes either in their heart or by saying out loud:

"My prayer is: _____. This is my prayer."

The people will respond:

People: This is our prayer.

Leader:

God of the shepherds, give your church humility, and to all who sit in darkness, alone, and afraid, the inspiration from heaven to go find you born afresh into the world. We pray especially for those whom we name aloud at this time: *The People speak the names of those on their hearts.*

The Leader concludes saying,

I ask your prayers for all who seek God, or a deeper knowledge of God.


People: God of Mary and Elizabeth, give your church grace to be pregnant with hope and to bring forth new life for a barren world.

Pray for those who have died.

The people are invited to offer names either in their heart or out loud. Afterwards, silence is kept.

The Collect for the Commemoration of Brother Skiles:

O God, whose blessed Son became poor that we through his poverty might be rich: Deliver us from an inordinate love of this world, that we, inspired by the devotion of your servant William West Skiles, may serve you with singleness of heart, and attain to the riches of the age to come; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Birthday and Anniversary Prayer:

Watch over your child(ren) O Lord, as their days increase.
Bless and guide them wherever they may be.
Strengthen them when they stand.
Comfort them when discouraged or sorrowful.
Raise them up if they fall.
And in their heart(s) may your peace which passes understanding, abide with them all the days of their lives; through Jesus Christ, Our Lord, Amen.

Concerning The Holy Communion

A reminder that all present are welcome to the Communion regardless of Christian denomination. We consider it an honor and privilege to commune with all present as one united body of Christ.

To receive the bread, extend your hands towards the priest. To receive the wine, guide the bottom of the chalice with both hands. To receive the bread and wine together via intinction, place your right hand over your left shoulder. To receive a blessing instead of the bread and wine, cross your arms across your chest.

If you have a gluten allergy, simply inform the priest when you come to the rail.

The Great Thanksgiving

Adapted from liturgy of the Iona Community

Priest: The Lord be with you. *People:* And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord, our God.

People: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

It is indeed right, for you made us, most holy God. And before us, you made the world we inhabit, and before the world, you made the eternal home in which, through Christ, we have a place.

We praise you, O God, whom eternity cannot contain, for coming to earth and entering time in Jesus.

We praise you for his life which informs our living, for his compassion which changes our hearts, for his clear speaking which contradicts our harmless generalities, for his disturbing presence, his innocent suffering, his fearless dying, his rising to life breathing forgiveness and restoring us forever to you. For these gifts we praise and worship you.

All that is spectacular, all that is plain have their origin in you. All that is lovely, all who are loving, point to you as their fulfillment. Therefore we gladly join our voices to the song of the Church on earth and in heaven:

The Sanctus: #<u>S-130</u>

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might, Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full, full of your glory: Hosanna in the highest. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the Name of the Lord: Hosanna in the highest. Hosanna in the highest.

All kneel or stand as they are able.

Jesus was always the guest. In the homes of Peter and Jairus, Martha and Mary, Joanna and Susanna, he was always the guest. At the meal tables of the wealthy where he pled the case of the poor, he was always the guest. Upsetting polite company, befriending isolated people, welcoming the stranger, he was always the guest.

But here, at this table, he is the host. Those who wish to serve him must first be served by him. Those who want to follow him must first be fed by him. For this is the table where God intends us to be nourished. This is the time when Christ can make us new.

So come, you who hunger and thirst for a deeper faith, for a better life, for a fairer world. Jesus Christ, who has sat at our tables, now invites us to be guests at his.

On the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

So now we do as Jesus did. We take this bread and this wine, the produce of the earth and the fruit of human labor. In these, Jesus has promised to be present; through these, Christ can make us whole.

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

People: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

We ask, merciful God, that you send, in kindness, your Holy Spirit to settle on this bread and wine and fill them with the fullness of Jesus. Let that same Spirit rest on us, converting us from the patterns of this passing world, until we conform to the shape of him whose food we now share. All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.

People: AMEN.

And now, gathered as one in the Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us:

#67 "Comfort, Comfort, Ye My People" #339 "Deck Thyself, My Soul, with Gladness"


