

Joyous summer greetings! What a blessing to reside in the High Country, with its beautiful summer splendor! In the month of July, the Holy Cross Choir takes a rest, and we welcome a steady stream of special guest musicians. The Choir resumes in August, with an appearance at the St. John's worship on August 18. And more talented guests join us at the Holy Cross worship on that same day! It's a summer you won't want to miss. Please read below for all the details.

Sunday, July 7 brings five unique instrumentalists to the 11:00 a.m. worship. Parishioner, David Johnston, processes us into and out of the service with traditional Bagpipes. This festive event pays homage to the Scottish and Irish roots of the High Country; a must-see experience! The Prelude and Offertory this day feature the Canon Music Camp Faculty Saxophone Quartet. In instrumental order, they are: Ben Bradburn (soprano), Adam Kallestad (alto), Jimie Maley (tenor), and Scott Kallestad (baritone). Enjoy some light jazz-style renderings (Prelude), along with wonderful French harmonies (Offertory); a true feast for the ears!

Sunday, July 14 we plan to welcome Amber Koeppen, Harpist, to our worship. Amber is on the Harp faculty at the Hayes School of Music (ASU), and brings a wealth of talent, experience, and energy to her award-winning Harp-playing! She will offer the Prelude and Offertory this day, and join on a hymn or two as well. Having played a solo recital at St. John's a few years ago, she is no stranger to our parish; however, this will be her first visit to Holy Cross!

Sunday, July 21 re-unites two special string players, who are "all grown up now!" Yes, Jaidyn Toomey (Cello) and Marie Kallestad (Violin) join forces to offer some heavenly String Duets for the Prelude and Offertory. It's a treat to welcome these young ladies back home!

Sunday, July 28 features an Offertory with a vocal quartet from within our very own Choir! They will offer a new setting of Fanny Crosby's familiar Gospel hymn, *I am Thine, O Lord.* This new arrangement (*Draw Me Nearer, Blessed* Lord) by Susan Naylor Callaway, updates the text with a lilting melody and truly gorgeous harmonies.

Our Holy Cross Choir resumes rehearsals and anthems in August. The Offertory for Sunday, August 4 is *Have You Not Known?* by composer K. Lee Scott. Based on Isaiah 40: 21-31, the music weaves a simple melody into both 4-part harmonies and a short men's statement, before soaring into a mighty cadence. The anthem for August 11 is a creative "take" on J.S. Bach's *Suite No.1 for unaccompanied Cello*. Composer Roland Martin adapts the beloved hymn tune, *Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing*, to this arpeggiated (Cello) bass line. The result is a very fluid, contemplative "re-boot" of the usual version.

Sunday, August 18 brings the Holy Cross Choir to the 9:00 a.m. St. John's service, with an upbeat, contemporary anthem, *Jubilate, Alleluia!* With its rhythmic energy and spirited tempo, composer Mary Lynn Lightfoot has crafted a winner; and a strong "earworm" as well! At the 11:00 a.m. worship, our very special guests will be the *Meister Singers* Youth Choir from the Charlotte Choir School at St. Peter's Episcopal Church. Together with Director, Elizabeth Lenti and Organist, Andrew Pester, the *Meister Singers* will offer magnificent settings of traditional English literature for the Offertory and Communion portions of the service. Please mark your calendars for this very cherished day!

Finally, August 25 features a soulful arrangement by Jack Schraeder, of Glenn Burleigh's Black Gospel piece, *Order My Steps*. With its "blues-y" keyboard style, and its prayerful text, *Order My Steps* has won multiple nominations and awards over the years; including for "Song of the Year" at the 1995 Dove Awards. Join us this day, and see "why!"

Many of you have been in Crab Orchard Hall (located next to the Apple Barn) which is used as meeting space for groups staying at the VCCC. Did you know that at one time this was the Chapel of the Holy Cross? It was used as the church building until 1926 when the congregation moved to the present church building. The" Notes" this month is about the old chapel building and how it was used during the early 1980's. This information comes from an article in the October 1981 "The Highland Churchman" – the Diocese of Western NC monthly newsletter.

"The long unused chapel at the Mission School Conference Center (VCCC) in Valle Crucis is coming to life once more to the sounds of hammers and saws as the interior of the old structure takes on a more modern look. Community volunteers are working to make a dream come true by September 22nd(1981) when it will open its doors as a licensed Day Care facility known as the Valle Crucis Day School, the only such unit between Banner Elk and Boone.


The School is scheduled to be in session week-days 6:30am to 5:30pm with professional staff for children from 2 years to kindergarten age and in addition to providing child care for working mothers there will be a strong emphasis on program. According to Helen Tester, Chairperson of the Day School Committee, much support has been received from the community and many organizations realizing the need for this type of place. The Mission School Conference Center is providing the use of the building rent-free and has supplied labor and material as well. The Valle Crucis Summer Youth Program built the play ground and play equipment. A grant of \$2,700 from the accumulated Trust Fund Income (of the Diocese of Western NC) was approved at the Diocesan Convention in 1981 and will construct the kitchen, storage rooms, doors, baths, building materials and fencing for the playground. Special fund-raising projects resulted in \$1,000 from such events as cake walks, barn square dances, a "Feast and Fashion Show". The annual Valle Fair sponsored by Holy Cross Church also contributed funds.

Much remains to be done before opening day and supplies needed are toys and tables and chairs. Money is urgently needed both for construction and equipment but additionally for establishing scholarships for children from needy families. The renaissance of the old chapel at Valle Crucis is another example of church people at work in their local community, realizing a need and seeing that it is fulfilled."

In the same issue of "The Highland Churchman" was an article about the Summer Youth Program which helped in the day school project.

"The Valle Crucis Summer Youth Program has chalked up another success, according to Ms. Helen Tester, who reported to the recent meeting of the Executive Committee on the 1981 program. Ms. Ginny Walter, a former participant and current director, her staff and the 8 participants built the playground for the Valle Crucis Day Care Center being established in the old chapel building at the Valle Crucis Mission School Conference Center. This served as the community focus for the summer program; the young people continued their over-all purpose of establishing and participating in an explicit Christian community. Tester observed that this objective was beautifully met. She urged that young people of high school age begin to consider the summer youth program as an option for 1982."
